

MERCER BOROUGH REGULAR MEETING

FEBRUARY 2ND 2016

Jac Carter led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Joe Kutanich stated that he would forward a permit application for work to be done in a floodplain area so that it could be delivered to Tomeo Farms.

Frank Curl informed council that the PSAB had information on Landlord/Tenant Property Inspections that will be discussed at the Spring Conference.

Jerry Johnson informed council that he was planning on meeting with the Mercer Area School District to see if there was any interest in the Junior Council program.

Jerry Johnson asked to table approving the Mercer County Housing PILOT program until the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Council discussed a request from the business "A Taste of N'Awlins" food truck to park on the Borough's Streets from approximately 10:00 A.M until 2:00 P.M. Council decided that they can sell food in the Borough with the proper state permits but would have to park on private property with permission from the property owners if they were violating the parking ordinance.

Caroline DaCosta asked council if they would pay for the Borough's Association boot camp training to be held at the Hampton Inn in Meadville on February 12th and 13th from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. She informed council that she would be arrive Thursday night and come back on Saturday after the training. Frank Curl moved to send Caroline DaCosta to boot camp with Gary Hancock seconding. Vote carried unanimously.

REPORTS

Joe Kurtanich advised council that the Borough building lateral and main line had blockages requiring excavation and repair. He also reported that Aqua Water is proposing water line replacement on N. Pitt Street and North and South Diamond Street this Spring between the hours of 7:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. Mr. Kurtanich informed council that the STU grant application for South Diamond Street Sidewalks and Streetscape was submitted to the MCRPC and MPO committee on January 22nd. Frank Curl added that he would like to coordinate the work with Aqua water if awarded funding for the project. In regards to the Sewer Plant controls, Mr. Kurtanich advised council that MS Controls have everything working at this time.

Frank Curl announced that Mercer Borough was not approved for the Brandy Springs Park Grant but would be reviewing the proposal for the next funding round. He also announced that the Brandy Springs Park Board public meeting was changed to the 3rd Monday of every month.
