

MERCER BOROUGH REGULAR MEETING

January 13, 2026

Nick Sicilian called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Savannah Bungar moved to approve the December 9, 2025 and January 13th 2026 Minutes with Marc Zickar seconding. Vote carried unanimously. Justin Wagner moved to approve the December 2025 Financial Reports with Marc Zickar seconding. Vote carried unanimously. Savannah Bungar moved to approve the Payment of Bills with Marc Zickar seconding. Vote carried unanimously.

VISITORS – Sandra Craft informed council that there were issues that she would like to review. She advised council that there was flooding in the Peach Street area around the District Justice office causing problems with a house that is for sell. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Bob Kish moved not to amend the current Burning Ordinance with Cliff Hughes seconding. Vote carried unanimously.

Nick Sicilian recommended not participating the in Municipal Seal Coat program this year due to the paving projects that may need done this year.

NEW BUSINESS

Savannah Bungar moved to approve Resolution # 1 2026 waiving Police Retirement Contributions as required in the Police Agreement. Cliff Hughes seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Nick Sicilian informed council that Cliff Hughes and Debra Sicilian would be added as authorized check signers for the new year.
